

WEST END SCHOOL (P NTH)

ENROLMENT SCHEME

HOME ZONE

All students who live within the boundaries of the home zone described below (see attached map for specific details relating to addresses) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

West End School defines a catchment area bounded by:

Pioneer Highway, West Street, Church Street, Linton Street, Park Road, Ruha Street, Dittmer Drive, Pitama Road, College Street, Panako Place, Newbury Street, Cardiff Street, Wakefield Street, Salford Place, Winchester Street, Stafford Place and Warwick Place.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

SPECIAL PROGRAMMES

The school operates the following special programme:

Attached Unit catering for high and very high ORRS funded students.

Students who live within the school's home zone and meet the criteria for enrolment in the special programme will be enrolled ahead of out of zone students.

The optimum roll in the unit is believed to be 7 very high needs students and 7 high needs students

The criteria for acceptance into the programmes are as described in the priority order below:

Meets the criteria as determined for high and very high needs at detailed in the Ongoing Reviewable Resourcing Scheme.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

Each year the Board will determine the number of places that are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify the date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority.

First Priority	Must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in the special programme run by the school (defined above) and approved by the Secretary of Education.
Second Priority	Must be given to applicants who are sibling of current students.
Third Priority	Must be given to applicants who are sibling of former students.
Fourth Priority	Must be given to any applicant who is the child of a former student of the school.
Fifth Priority	Must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the Board of the school or a child of a member of the Board of the school.
Sixth Priority	Must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in that area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status will be requested to give proof of a sibling relationship.
